
Budget


Major tourist attractions include:

- The historic Grand-Place, home to Brussels' world famous Flower Carpet (Olympic-themed for 2024), which is also the heart of Brussels.
- The Atomium, a remnant of Expo 58 held in Brussels and now a symbol of Belgium.



Venues

A large portion of our budget is dedicated towards a new Olympic Park. The Olympic Park will feature six state-ofthe-art stadiums: a Basketball stadium. a multi-use indoor stadium, a gymnastics centre, an aquatics centre and a 70.000 seat athletics stadium. Outside of the Olympic Park, we are building a new Tennis stadium and Water Polo stadium. These are two very popular sports in Belgium and don't have a main venue in Brussels. The park will not only include these stadiums, but will also include several apartment buildings to host the athletes during the Olympics. These will later be transformed to develop a new modern neighbourhood in Southern Brussels.
